OPENING REMARKS & WELCOME

Chief, Enoch Cree Nation

Billy excelled academically from the beginning of his educational journey at the Kitaskinaw School at Enoch, through his Sr. High School years at St. Francis Xavier, where he achieved honor role status, graduating at the age of 15.

After graduation, he worked at the North On 60 Convenience Store and played sports until he decided, with support and encouragement from his family, to continue his education at N.A.I.T.

In 2011, Billy earned a Diploma in Civil Engineering Technology from N.A.I.T. and continued studying towards a Bachelor of Technology Management Civil Engineering Technology which he received in 2013.

Also in 2011, Billy was employed through the Alberta Summer Student Program at ATCO as Senior Forester Assistant, Engineering and Construction, Forest Operations, Supervisory and Standards in Edmonton. Since May 2012, he worked with the Government of Alberta/Ministry of Aboriginal Relations in the intern At Your Alberta program.

Billy was honored with the Aboriginal Role Models of Alberta Youth & Academic Award in October 2012. In 2013, at the age of 26, he ran for Enoch Cree Nation leadership and won a seat on Council. In June 2015, Billy was elected Chief of the Enoch Cree Nation.

Billy is a true role model for all people; young and old. He is active in traditional and cultural celebrations in the community.

He has proven his ability to lead, doing this by example and always encouraging young people to get involved in the community and outside the boundaries of the Enoch Cree Nation.
